

What is an Irrigation Non-Expansion Area (INA)?

An INA is an area designated by the Director of the Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR) to stop farming of additional acres of agriculture. **An INA DOES NOT IMPACT new residential** gardens or field less than 2 acres in size.

Water Levels Declining.


indicate that some **water levels have** declined by 40 to 48 feet in the Kingman Sub-basin since 1990. Left unchecked our wells will be depleted.

> **40–48 FT** WATER LEVEL DECLINE IN SOME WELLS


BY THE NUMBERS

Time to Act.

Failure to act will require the city to increase water rates to cover the cost of drilling new, deeper wells to access water. Failure to establish an INA will force City of Kingman to install up to 11 new wells at a cost of \$3 million per well to taxpayers.



Our Economy.

City of Kingman and Mohave County have understood the nature of our groundwater and have not planned for large-scale farming or irrigation. Despite our best planning efforts the state legislature has passed laws favoring large farming interest over residents and businesses, circumventing smart planning.



Lax Water Laws.

Arizona's laws favor large-scale agriculture over the needs of homeowners and virtually all other business types.



ARE NOT REQUIRED to follow Mohave County or City of Kingman Voter-Approved General Plans



ARE NOT REQUIRED to obtain Planning & Zoning Land Use Approvals



ARE NOT REQUIRED to hold Public Information Meetings



ARE NOT PROHIBITED from drilling as many wells as they want, as large as they want, as deep as they want

ARE NOT PROHIBITED from pumping unlimited quantities of groundwater



ARE NOT REQUIRED to meter largevolume wells or report how much water those wells are pumping in order to maintain a healthy basin
